

TICKETS ON SALE NOW FOR HISTORY MUSEUM'S BIGGEST-EVER EXHIBITION, CELEBRATING AMERICA'S 250TH

Video game technology creates interactive experiences with key moments of American Revolution

Charlotte, N.C., Dec. 8, 2025 – Tickets are on sale now for the Charlotte Museum of History's most ambitious exhibition ever, "American Revolution, the Augmented Exhibition." This national exhibition uses video game technology to immerse visitors in the defining moments that shaped the nation and its ideals of freedom and liberty.

"American Revolution, the Augmented Exhibition" opens to the public on April 14, 2026, and the Charlotte Museum of History is the only place in the Carolinas where people can see it.

The exhibition was developed by Histoverly in partnership with the Museum of the American Revolution in Philadelphia. It will be on display in multiple cities across the country in 2026 to coincide with the 250th anniversary of the American Declaration of Independence, with its East Coast debut at the Charlotte Museum of History. It travels to other U.S. cities through 2031 with a goal of reaching all 50 states.

Created with leading historians and scholars, "American Revolution, the Augmented Exhibition" combines the best in physical display and augmented reality to create a fully immersive historical experience that is engaging and easy-to-use for all ages.

Exhibition visitors travel back to the years 1763-1789 through interactive 3D recreations using Histoverly's patented HistoPad tablet. Along the journey, visitors explore key events such as the Boston Tea Party, the Constitutional Convention and the Battle of Yorktown; visit historic Boston, Philadelphia and New York; and learn about the diverse characters who contributed to America's founding.

"Charlotte Museum of History is the perfect place to host this exhibition. Our historic site has strong ties to the American Revolution via the 1774 Alexander Rock House and its original owner, Hezekiah Alexander, a Revolutionary statesman and framer of North Carolina's first Constitution and Bill of Rights," said Terri L. White, president and CEO of the Charlotte Museum of History. "We look forward to this once-in-a-lifetime exhibition bringing many more people to visit this vital piece of American history, and we hope it will encourage people to ponder our nation's guiding principles of freedom and liberty."

Earlier this month, [the state of North Carolina designated the 1774 Rock House as a site of statewide historic significance](#), recognizing it as an important historical, cultural and architectural landmark. The designation is extremely rare, with only 10 other properties in the state holding this title.

In preparation for the exhibition, the museum plans to renovate its museum shop and add a grab-and-go café so visitors can see the new exhibition and then spend the day at the historic site.

In addition to the national stories in the exhibition, the museum will dedicate a full gallery to telling the story of the Carolinas during the American Revolution. The Revolution in the Carolinas exhibition includes local scenes such as Captain Jack's ride from Charlotte to Philadelphia, pivotal American victories at King's Mountain and Cowpens and the local resistance to the British occupation at the Battle of Charlotte. The Carolinas exhibition is presented by the John William Pope Foundation.

Major supporters of the exhibition include the John William Pope Foundation, Mecklenburg County, Foundation for the Carolinas and the City of Charlotte.
