Grades K-1 Program Outline

Goal: Students will achieve their targeted learning objectives in alignment with the North Carolina Social Studies standards by exploring historically significant sites, participating in interactive activities and demonstrations, and engaging in collaborative inquiry.

Students will be able to:

- Compare and contrast life in the 18th century with modern life, identifying key similarities and differences.
- Describe the appearance and characteristics of Charlotte in the 18th century.
- Define natural resources and their significance.
- Explain how people used natural resources to improve their daily lives.
- Analyze how the environment influenced lifestyle and living conditions in the past.
