

ENJOY "SPIRITS OF THE SEASON" AT MUSEUM'S TWELFTH NIGHT PARTY

CHARLOTTE, N.C., Dec. 13, 2022 – Cap off the Christmas season with a Twelfth Night party at the Charlotte Museum of History on Saturday, Jan. 7, from 6-8:30 p.m.

This year's party features North Carolina's long history of distilling and brewing. Festivities include tastings from Great Wagon Road Distillery, Seven Jars Distillery and The Olde Mecklenburg Brewery, plus themed tours of the historic 1774 Rock House and homesite, live music and a lecture about moonshine and bootlegging by Daniel Pierce, professor of history at the University of North Carolina Asheville and author of "Tar Heel Lightnin."

How to Go

Must be 21 or older. Members receive free basic admission, or \$10 off any other ticket. Tickets and information at <u>charlottemuseum.org under the Events tab.</u>

Three ticket levels:

- Basic admission is \$10.
- Admission, plus beer and spirits samplings is \$25.
- Admission, drink samplings, snacks and a themed tour of the historic 1774 Rock House and homesite is \$35.
