CHARLOTTE, N.C., Dec. 3, 2024—Kick off your new year with a Twelfth Night party at the Charlotte Museum of History on Saturday, Jan. 4, from 6-9 p.m., featuring festive music and samples of local spirits throughout the museum's historic site.

You'll experience history through all your senses—watch exclusive moonshine-making demonstrations, enjoy tastings of locally-crafted spirits, hear Dr. Megan Cherry explain 18th-century southern distilling practices and step back in time with historic cooking demonstrations in the museum's restored log kitchen.

How to Go

Must be 21 or older. Tickets are \$40 (\$30 for museum members) at <u>charlottemuseum.org under the</u> Events tab.

The Charlotte Museum of History exists to save and share the Charlotte region's history, helping create a better understanding of the past and inspiring dialogue about the future. The museum is the steward of the 1774 Hezekiah Alexander Rock House and homesite, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is the oldest home in Mecklenburg County. The museum also is home to the historic Siloam School, which opened to the public as a historic site in 2024 after an eight-year fundraising and restoration effort.
