

CAP OFF CHRISTMAS WITH CHARLOTTE'S ONLY TWELFTH NIGHT PARTY

CHARLOTTE, N.C., Jan. 1, 2020 – Celebrate the last official night of Christmas with a party at Charlotte's oldest home on Saturday, Jan. 4, from 5:30-8:30 p.m.

This family-friendly event at The Charlotte Museum of History puts a modern spin on the 18th century's wildest party of the year. Based on traditional colonial celebrations, Twelfth Night closes out the holiday season with bonfires, hot cider, live music, games and revelry at the site of the historic 1774 Alexander Rock House.

The event is free, and there will be a cash bar. For \$5, you can take a guided tour of the historic home by candle light.

For the first time this year, the museum will offer a VIP experience that includes an exclusive guided tour of the 1774 Rock House and a whiskey flight in the rarely-seen Rock House cellar.

Traditional Twelfth Night is free and open to the public. Register for the VIP experience, offered at 6 p.m. and 7 p.m., at charlottemuseum.org under the **Events** tab.
