Museum's March Lunch & Learn features history storyteller Tom Phlegar

CHARLOTTE, N.C., Mar. 8, 2021 – In the next installment of its virtual Lunch & Learn series on Mar. 18, The Charlotte Museum of History will feature long-time museum volunteer and fan favorite tour guide Tom Phlegar. Phlegar will take listeners on a journey through the Southern Campaign of the American Revolution, exploring how the people of the Carolina Backcountry may have won the war.

“Tom has volunteered at the museum for more than 20 years, and he’s an amazing storyteller. Instead of dry, military history, Tom will share a collection of stories that humanize this history, including some of the little-known stories of African Americans who were part of the Revolution,” said Adria Focht, president and CEO of The Charlotte Museum of History.
